4. FIRST AID MEASURES

SMALL SPILLS

Wear protective equipment to prevent skin and eye

LARGE SPILLS

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling: Avoid eye contact and repeated or prolonged skin contact. Avoid inhalation of vapour, mist or aerosols.
